And also view of frankpledge or leet at the same place together with Court Baron, the perquisites and profits of them together with felons, fugitives, condemned persons, outlaws and suicides as often as they happen to occur during the term written below. Moreover he holds by the same indenture the Rectory of Morden aforesaid and all and singular the lands, rents, pastures, meadows and woods belonging to the said Rectory, together with all and singular the tithes, oblations, and other profits and rights belonging or pertaining to the said Rectory in whatever manner. Excepting the grant and presentation to the vicarage of St Laurence's church Morden aforesaid as often as it happens to be vacant.
