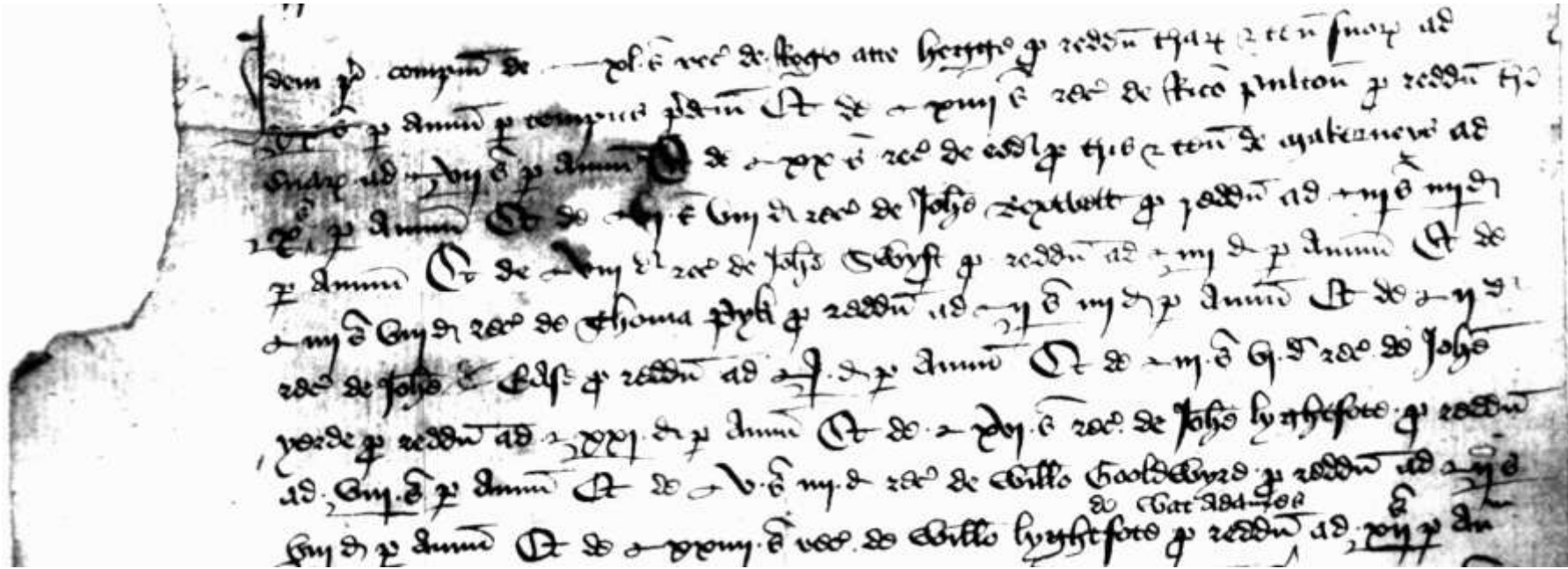


[Morden] – Account of John Sawger collector of rents of the Prior and convent of the Abbey of the blessed Peter of Westminster for their demesne of Morden and farmer of the manor and demesne lands of Monkon in the county of Surrey from Michaelmas Day 27th year of the reign of King Henry VI until Michaelmas Day 29th year of the same King, viz for 2 entire years. [1448-1450]

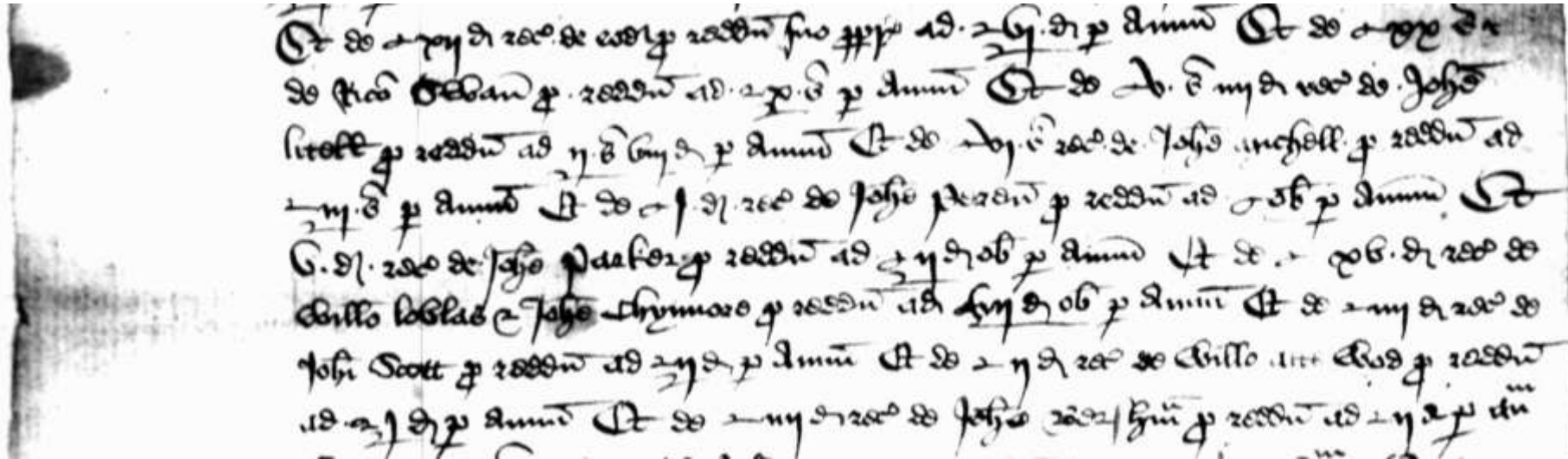

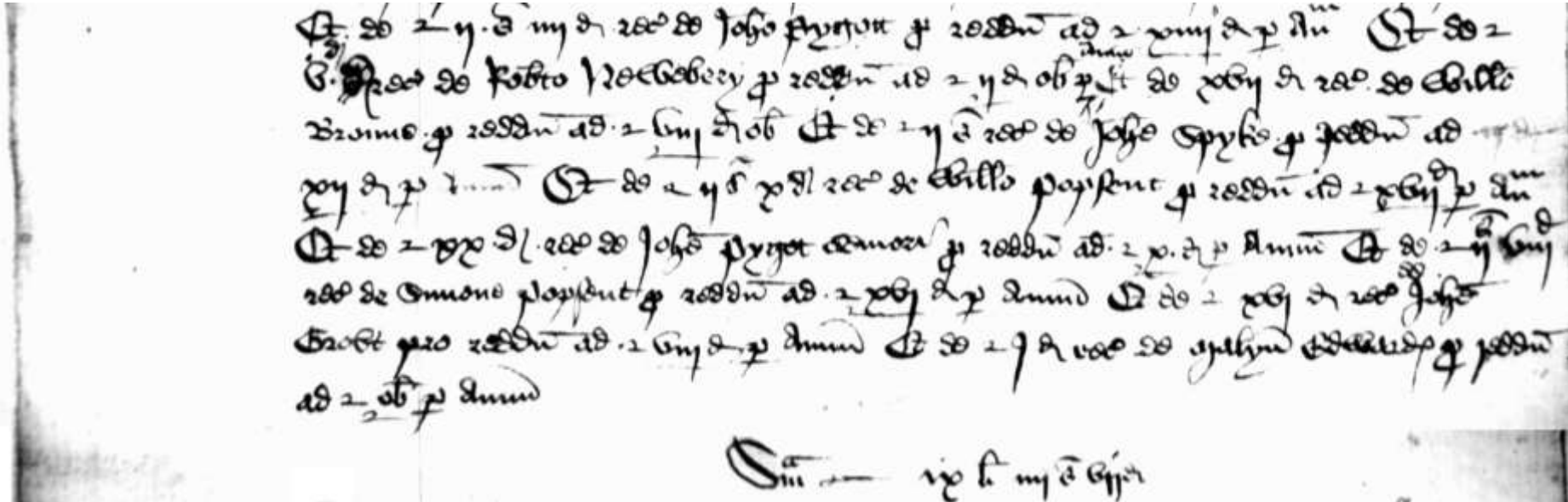

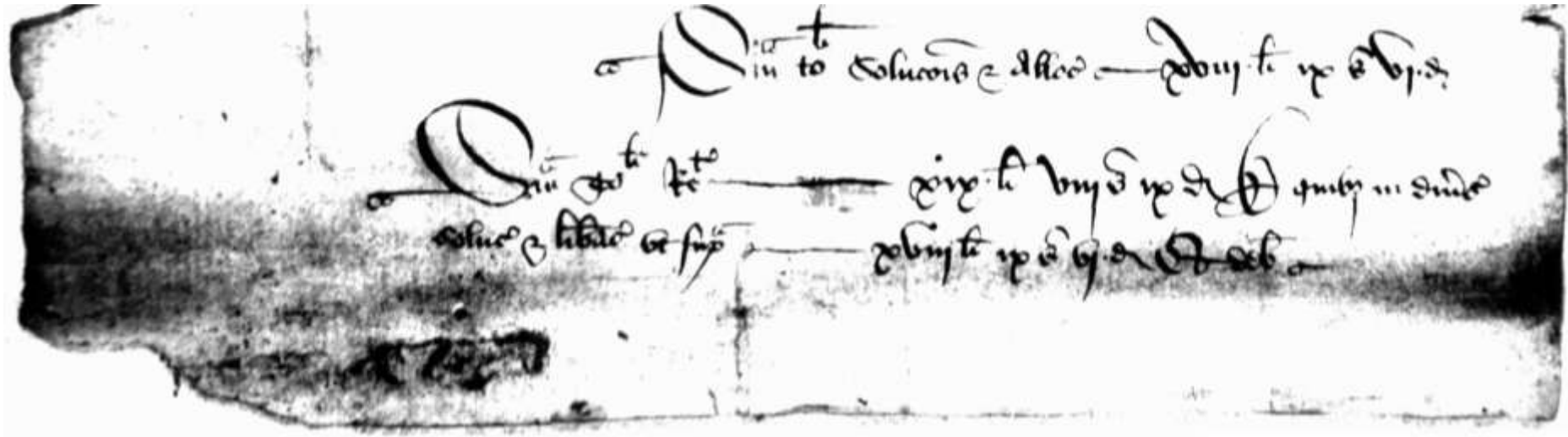
Repairs

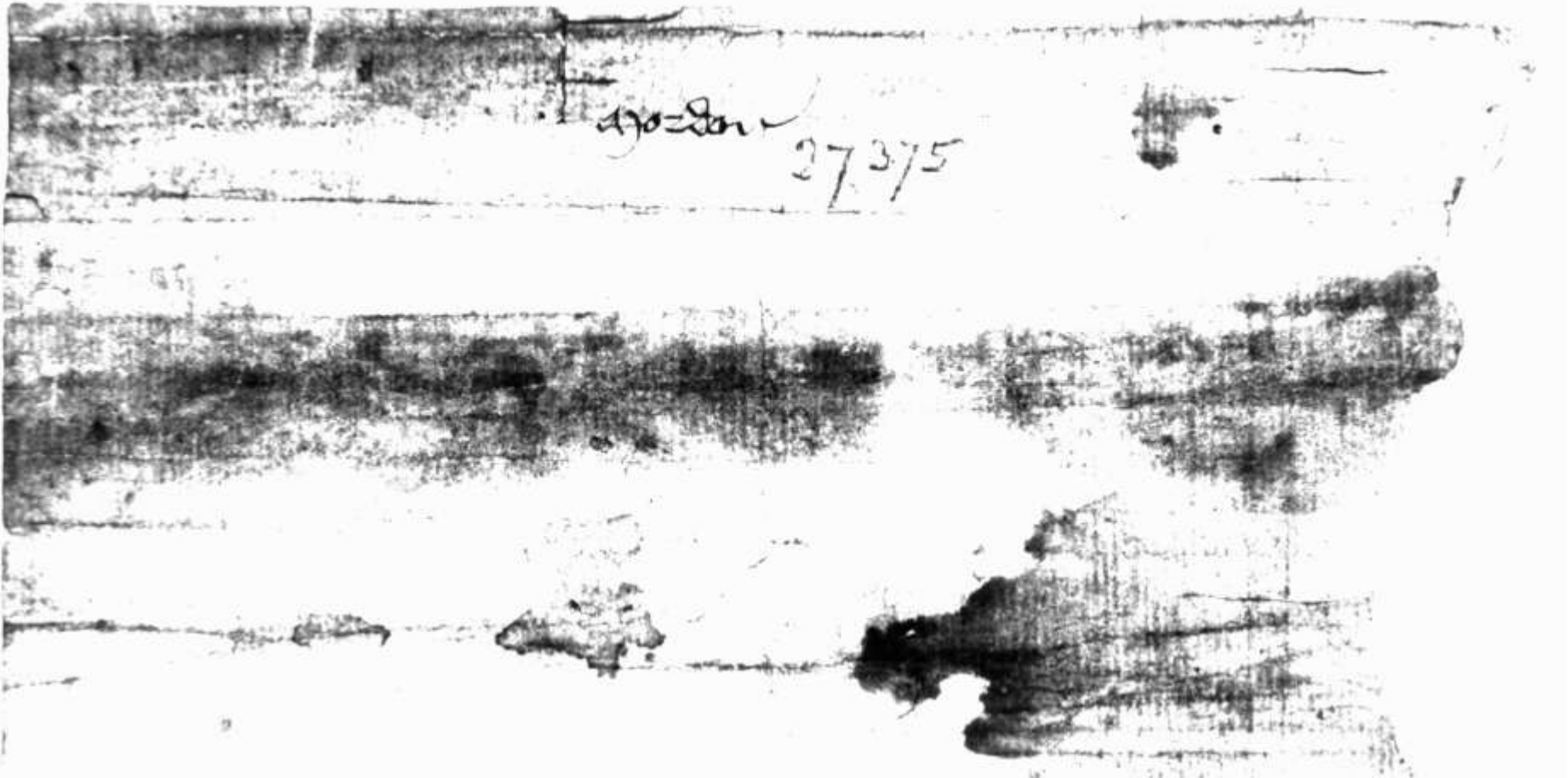

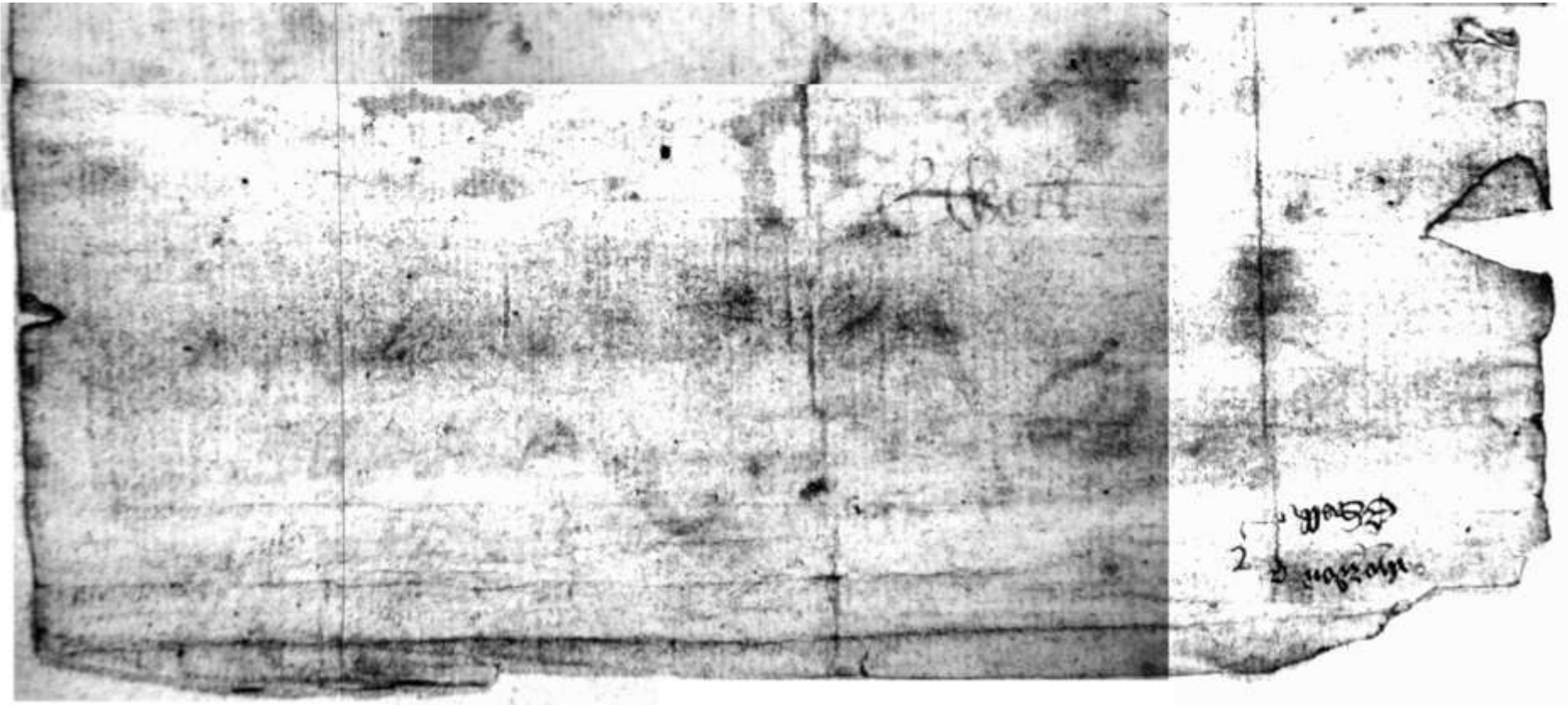
Sum of all payments and allowances £18 9s 6d.
