A suffragette garden party.

Staged in the grounds of Dorset Hall, former home of suffragette Rose Lamartine Yates, this event will feature a series of talks by suffrage historians, artwork produced by local schools and afternoon tea.

Rose for Rose: the Society also hopes to get a new rose named in honour of Mrs. Lamartine Yates, who was Organising Secretary of the Wimbledon Women's Social and Political Union. If successful, the commemorative rosebush will be planted in local parks, close to Rose's family home at Dorset Hall, Merton Park.
