

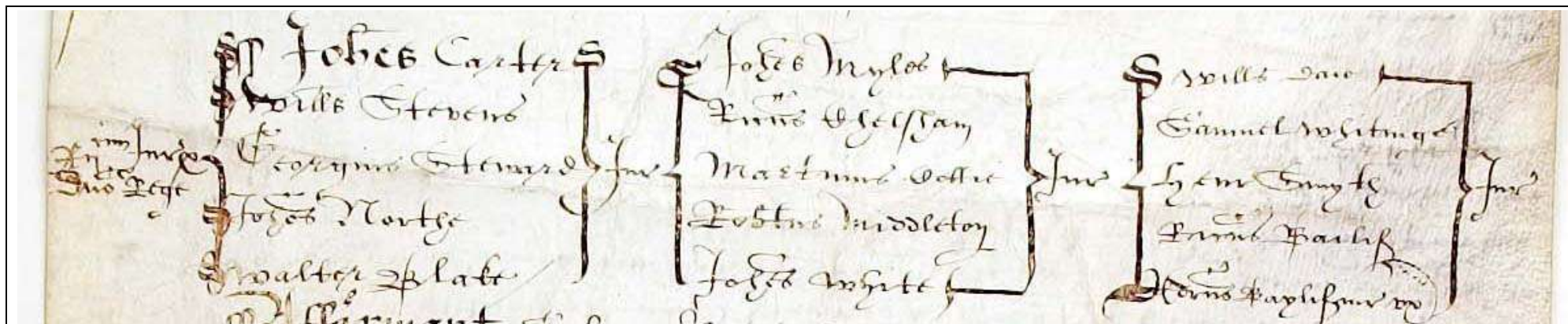

And that 1 lamb aged 4 months worth 3s 4d in the lord's custody came into this lordship as a stray around the feast of St John the Baptist last past and proclamation thereof was made in market and fair just as the custom is. And none come etc. And so it remains etc. And that one mare coloured [blank] worth 20s in the lord's custody came into the lordship as a stray around the feast of St Matthew the apostle last past and proclamation thereof was made in market and fair just as the custom is. And none come etc. And so it remains etc. And that one colt coloured [blank] worth 6s 8d in the lord's custody came into the lordship as a stray at the feast of All Saints last past and proclamation thereof etc. And none come etc. And so it remains etc.

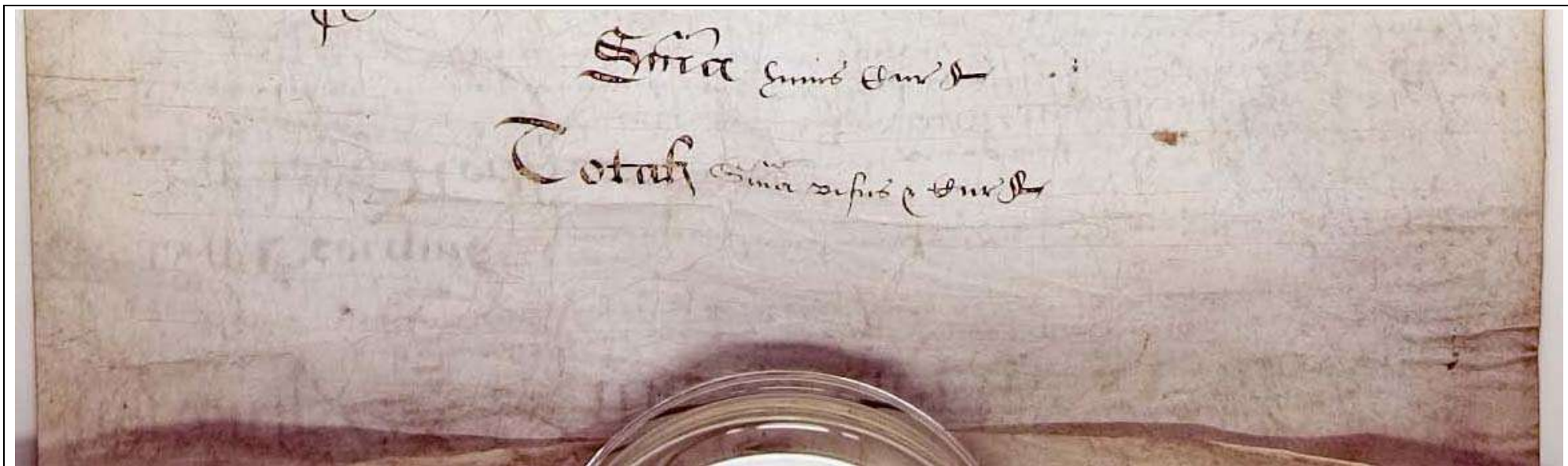
