

Rectory of Morden – Account of Ralph atte Rithe farmer at the same place from the eve of Michaelmas in the 23rd year of the reign of King Richard II after the Conquest until Michaelmas Day then next following, the 1st year of the reign of King Henry IV after the Conquest, for 1 entire year [1399-1400]

Sum of expenses and payments 30s. And he owes £8 10s*Quietus*

Which arrears, however, will be charged in the next account. And so he is quit in respect of this.
