

Morden Rectory – Account of John Spyk farmer at the same place from the eve of Michaelmas in the 7th year of the reign of King Henry IV after the Conquest until Michaelmas Day then next following the 8th year of the reign of the abovesaid King Henry, for 1 entire year [1406-1407]

Arrears

For arrears of his last account for the preceding year, £13 12s 7d.

Sum £13 12s 7d. approved.

Farm

For farm of the Rectory at the same place leased to John Spyk this year for tithe arising in the preceding harvest £9 3s 4d. Sum £9 3s 4d. approved.

Sum total of receipts with arrears £22 15s 11d.

approved.

Corn bought

In 1 quarter wheat bought for pension of the Vicar ~~6s 8d.~~^{5s 4d} In 1 quarter beans bought for the same ~~3s 8d.~~^{3s 4d}

Sum 8s 8d. approved.

Pension paid ^{by warden}

Paid to the aforesaid Vicar for his pension granted to him by the lord Prior and convent as long as it pleases the same 20s.

In cloth bought for the farmer's tunic by agreement, by view of the ~~bailiff~~ warden 7s.

Sum 27s. approved.

Chancel costs

In 1000 tiles bought with carriage 5s. In 3 bushels burnt lime [*calcec' adusti*] bought 6d. In 500 lathnails bought 5d. In stipend of 1 tiler for 5½ days roofing over the chancel hired with his lad 5s 0½d, taking between them per day 11d. In carrying water and sand for the same ~~18d.~~^{8d} ~~In stone~~
^{2 cartloads} bought at Chaldon [*Chalvedon*] with carriage 5s. ^{because in manor} Sum 11s 2½d.* approved

Cash Deliveries

Delivered to brother Roger Cretton warden for various issues by 1 tally, 105s 8d.

Sum 105s 8d. approved

Sum of all expenses and deliveries £7 12s 6½d. And he owes £15 3s 4½d.

Quietus

Which arrears, however, will be charged in the next account. And so he is quit in respect of this.

Value this year over and above pension paid £6 16s 5½d.†

DORSE

Wheat Of purchase as within 1 quarter. And accounted in pension paid to the Vicar at the same place. And it balances. approved.

Beans Of purchase as within 1 quarter. And accounted in pension paid to the Vicar at the same place. And it balances. approved.
