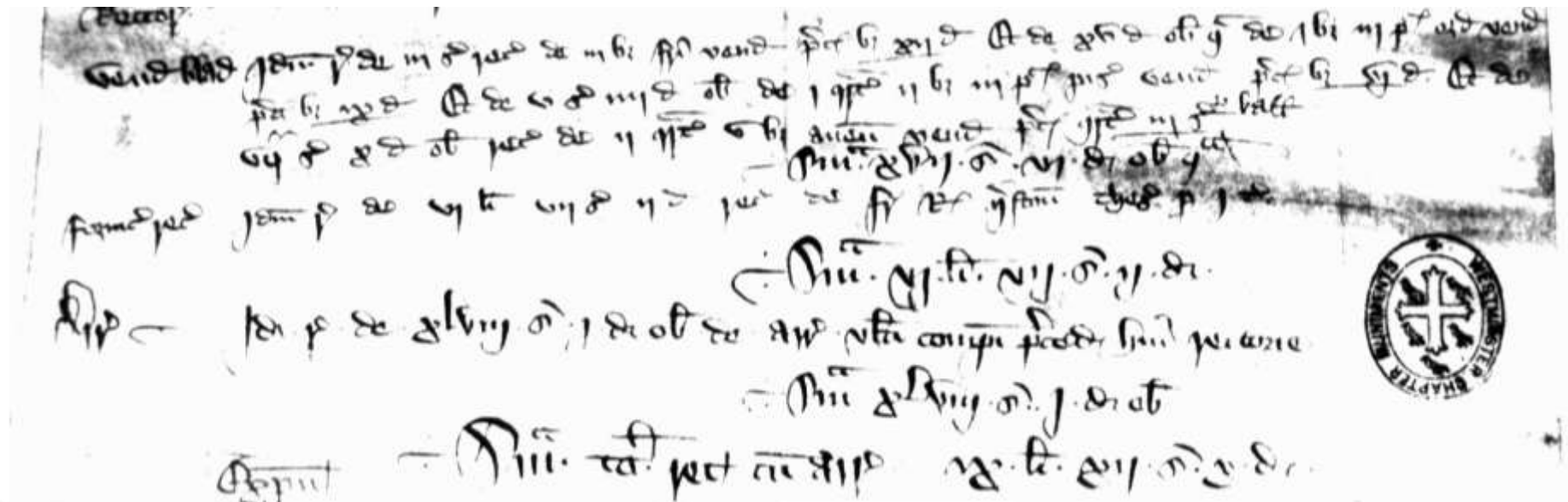


Morden Rectory: Account for the Rectory at the same place for the 32nd year.

Sale of corn

The same answers for 3s received for 3 bushels wheat sold, price of a bushel 12d. And for 15³/₄d for 1 bushel 3 pecks barley sold, price of a bushel 9d. And for 5s 4¹/₂d for 1 quarter 2 bushels 3 pecks peas sold, price of a bushel 6d. And for 7s 10¹/₂ received for 2 quarters 5 bushels oats sold, price of a quarter 3s. ^{by bailiff} Sum 17s 6³/₄d.

Foreign Receipts

The same answers for £6 7s 2d received of brother R Merston treasurer by 1 tally. Sum £6 7s 2d.

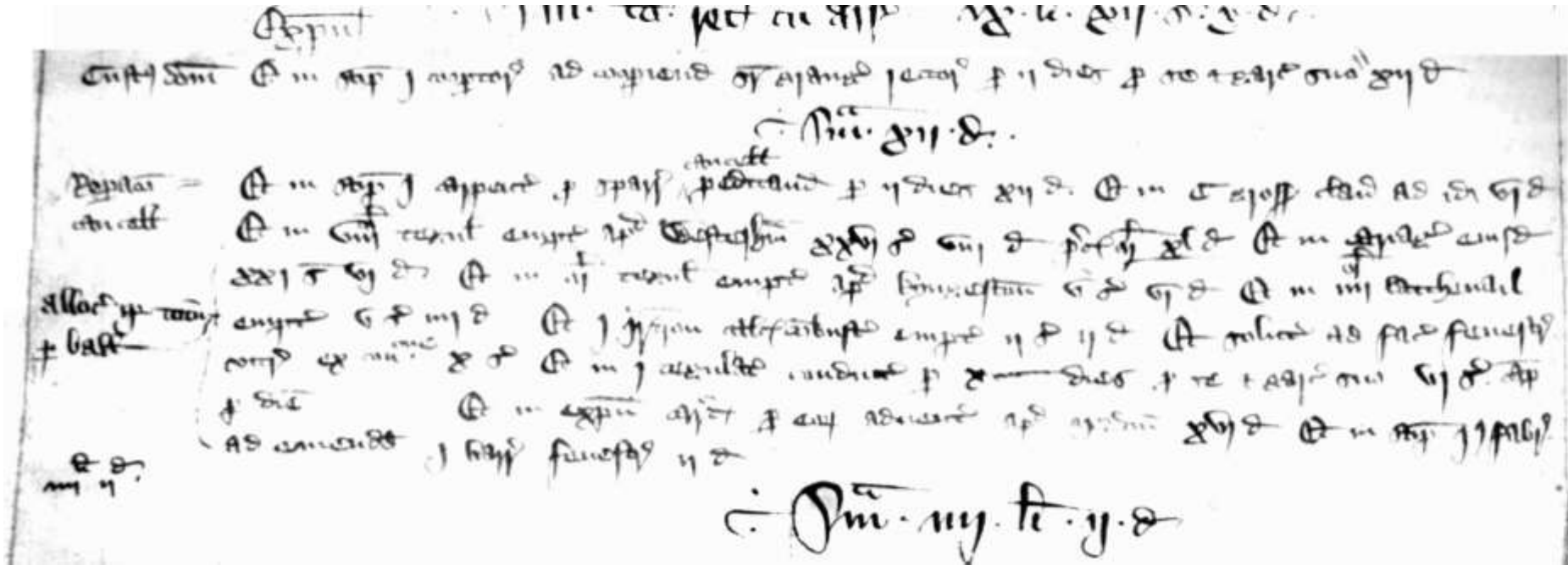
Arrears

The same answers for 48s 1¹/₂d of arrears of the last preceding account for this Rectory. Sum 48s 1¹/₂d.

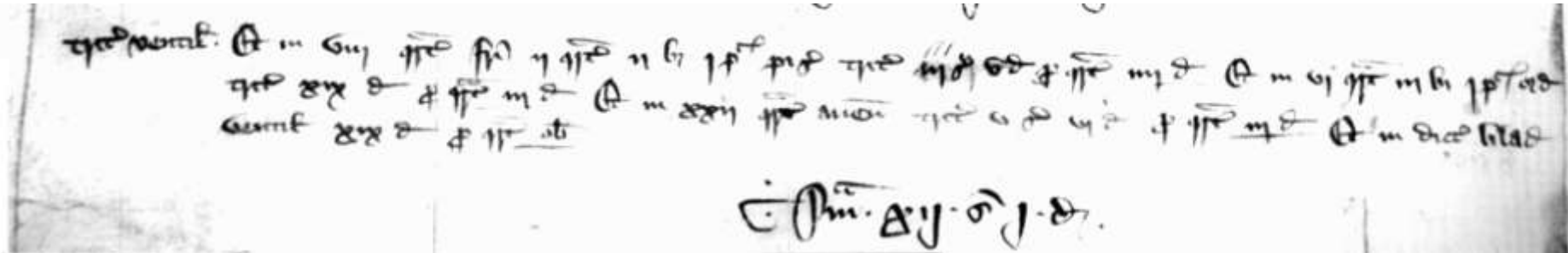


Building costs

And in stipend of 1 roofer for roofing over the rectory barn for 2 days for himself and his lad 12d. Sum 12d.

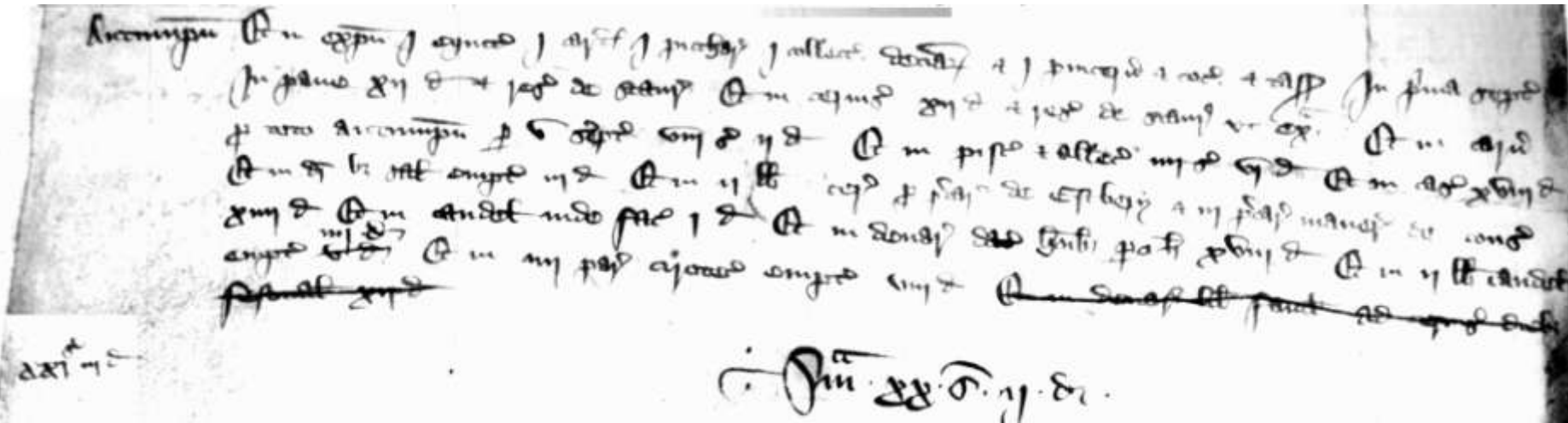
Chancel repairs allowed because all by the bailiff £4 2d.

And in stipend of 1 carpenter for treading the (roof) spars of the chancel [*sparr' cancell peditand*] for 2 days 12d. And in 100 large nails for the same 6d. And in 8000 tiles [*tegul'*] bought at Westerham 26s 8d, the price of 1000 40d. And in carriage of the same 21s 6d. And in 1000 tiles bought at Kingston 5s 6d. And in 4000 lathnails bought 5s 4d. And 1 quarter of a hundredweight [*quartron'*] of burnt lime [*calc' combust'*] bought 2s 2d. And payment for making window glass by agreement 10s. And in hiring 1 tiler for 10 days for himself and his mate 6s, taking per day [blank]. And in expenses of carts for their coming at Morden 16d. And in stipend of 1 smith for repairing 1 window bar 2d. Sum £4 2d.



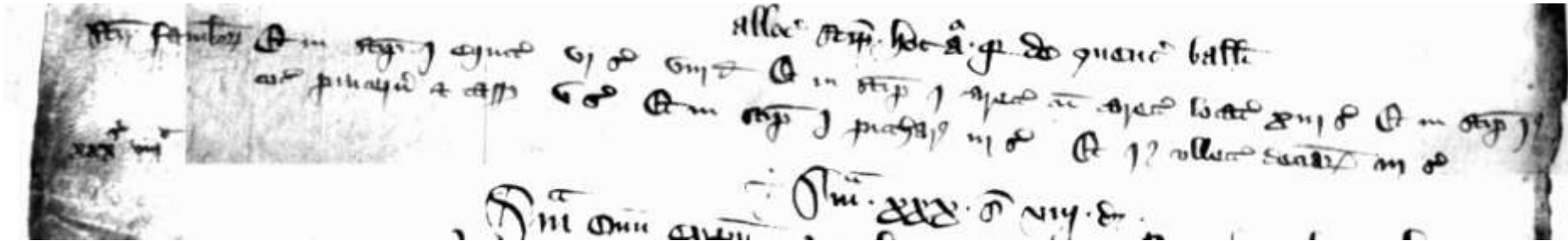
Threshing/winnowing

And in threshing 8 quarters wheat, 2 quarters 2 bushels peas 3s 5d, per quarter 4d. And in threshing 6 quarters 3 bushels 1 peck barley 19d, price of a quarter 3d. And in threshing 22 quarters oats 5s 6d, price of a quarter 3d. And in winnowing the said corn 19d, per quarter 1/2d. Sum 12s 1d.



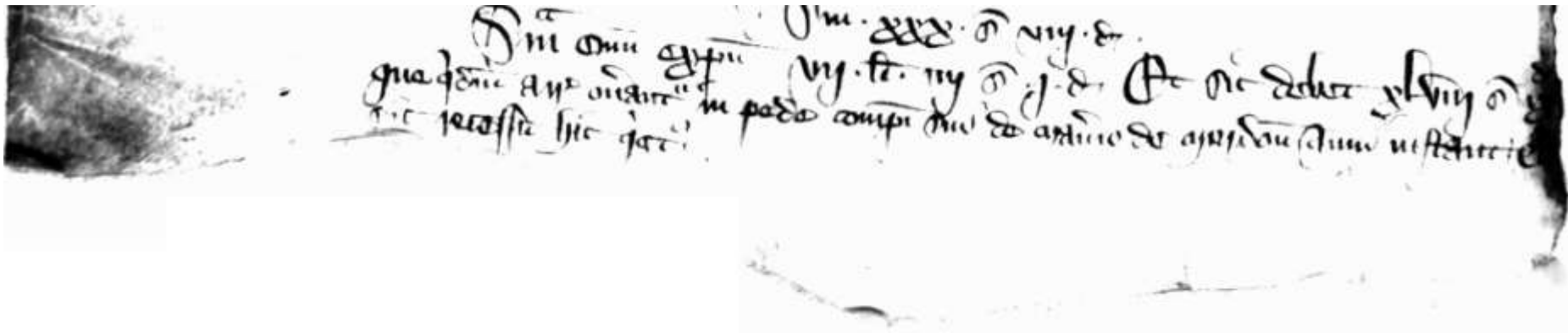
Harvest ^{21s 3d}

And in expenses of 1 rider [eq'tar'], 1 carter, 1 pitcher, 1 tithe collector, and 1 housekeeper and cook and stacker. In the first week: in bread 12d, and the rest from stock, and in ale 12d, and the rest from stock as overleaf. And in meat for the whole of harvest for 5 weeks 8s 2d. And in fish and herring 4s 6d. And in cheese 18d. And in 1/2 bushel salt bought 3d. And in 2lb wax bought for boonwork at Estbury and 3 boonworks for the manor by custom 14d. And in making candles thereof 1d. And in cash given to men of the parish 18d. And in 2 lb of candles bought 5d.^{4d} And in 4 pairs gloves bought 8d. ~~And in cash delivered to servants at two festivals 12d.~~ Sum 20s 2d.



Servants' stipends ^{30s 8d}.

And in stipend of 1 rider 6s 8d. ^{allowed stipend this year because by agreement [convent] of bailiff} And in stipend of 1 carter with 1 cart hired with 2 horses 13s. And in stipend of 1 cook, butler and stacker 5s. And in stipend of 1 pitcher 3s. And 1 tith collector 3s. Sum 30s 8d.

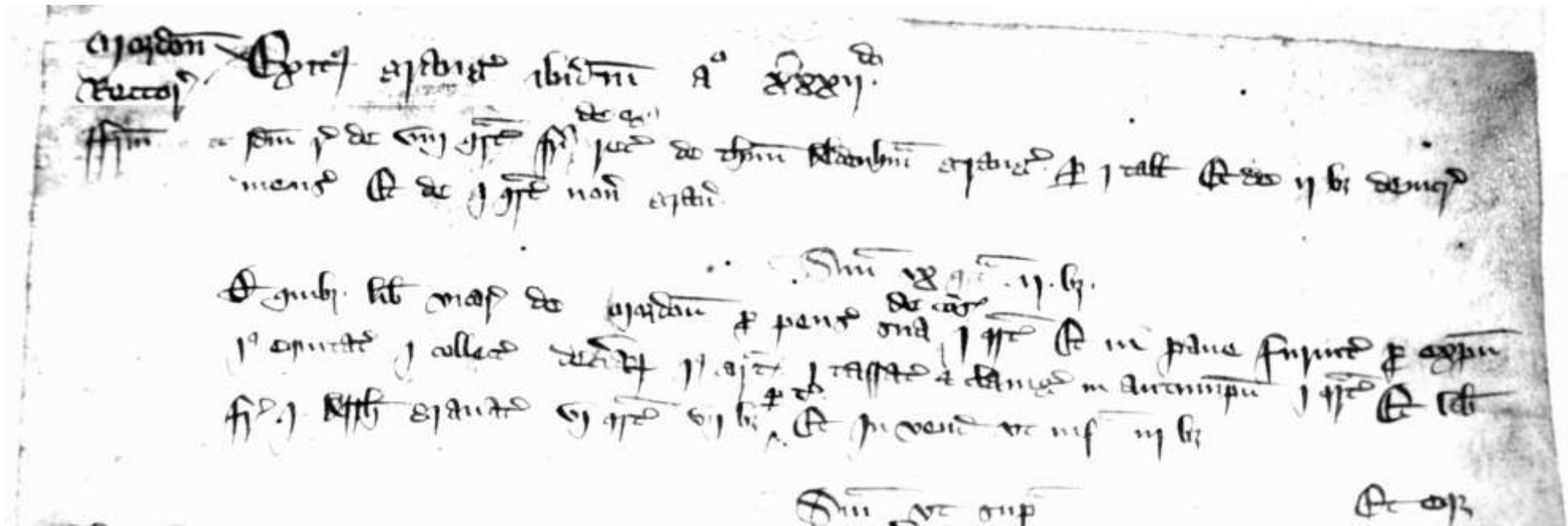


Sum of all expenses £7 4s 1d. And so he owes 48s 9d

Which arrears however are charged at the foot of his account for the manor of Morden this year. So he departed here quit.

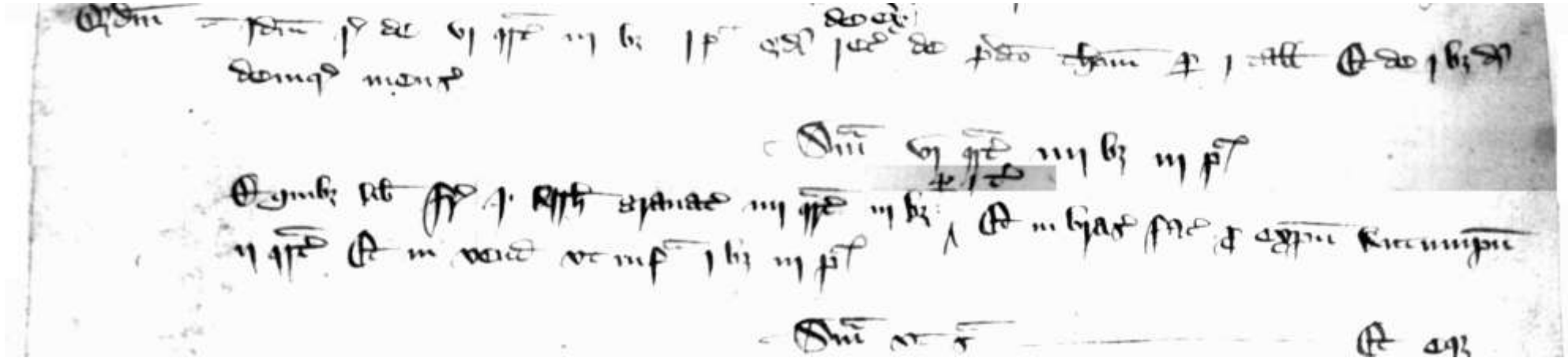

Rectory of Morden: Issues of the grange at the same place of the rectory 32nd year.



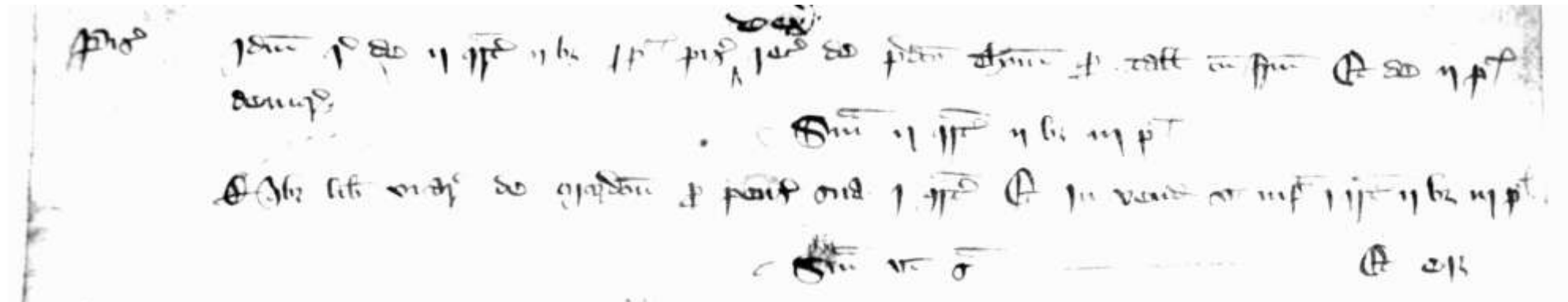
Wheat The same answers for 8 quarters wheat ^{of issue} received from Thomas Aldenham granger by 1 tally. And for 2 bushels of increment of measure. And for 1 quarter new grain. Sum 9 quarters 2 bushels.

Of which delivered to the vicar of Morden for his pension ^{by custom} 1 quarter. And in baking bread for expenses of 1 rider, 1 tithe collector, 1 carter, 1 stacker and cellarer in harvest 1 quarter. And delivered to brother J Assh keeper of the granary 6 quarters 7 bushels. ^{by tally} And in sale as within 3 bushels. Sum as above. And it balances.



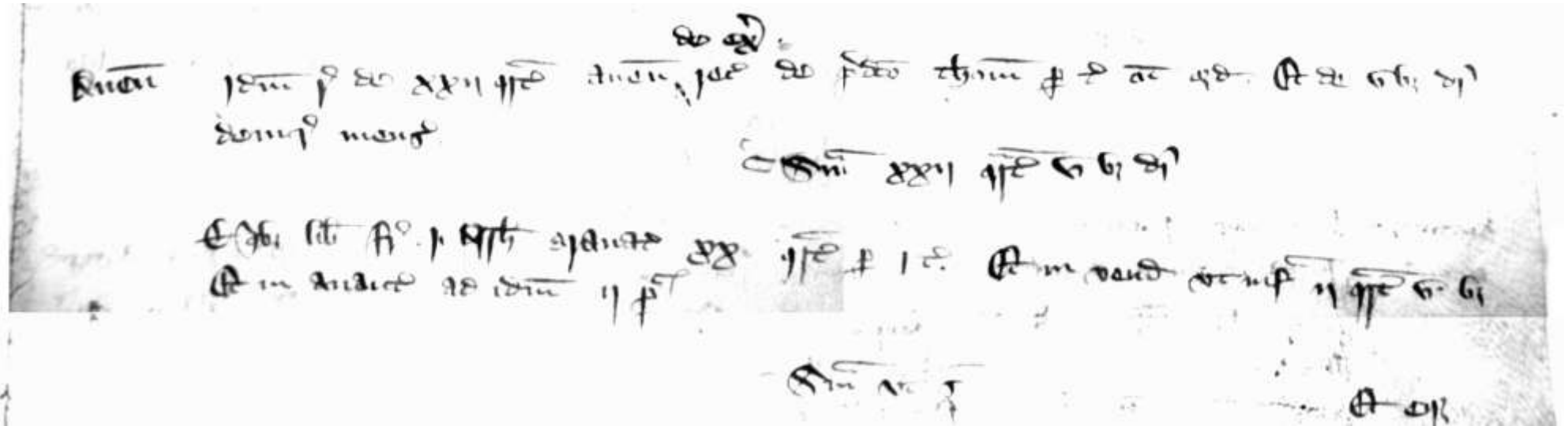
Barley The same answers for 6 quarters 3 bushels 1 peck barley ^{of issue} received of the aforesaid Thomas by 1 tally. And for 1½ bushels of increment of measure. Sum 6 quarters 4 bushels 3 pecks.

Of which delivered to brother J Assh keeper of the granary 4 quarters 3 bushels. ^{by 1 tally} And in making malt for harvest expenses 2 quarters. And in sale as within 1 bushel 3 pecks. Sum as above. And it balances.

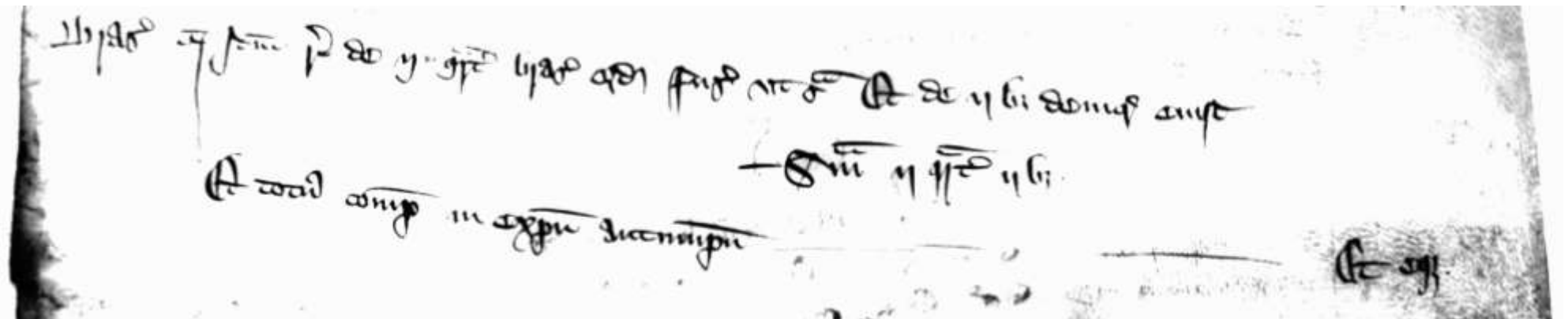


Peas The same answers for 2 quarters 2 bushels 1 peck peas ^{of issue} received of the aforesaid Thomas by tally with wheat. And for 2 pecks of increment. Sum 2 quarters 2 bushels 3 pecks.

Of which delivered to the vicar of Morden for his pension 1 quarter. And in sale as within 1 quarter 2 bushels 3 pecks. Sum as above. And it balances.



Oats The same answers for 22 quarters oats ^{of issue} received of the aforesaid Thomas by tally with barley. And for 5½ bushels of increment of measure. Sum 22 quarters 5½ bushels.
 Of which delivered to brother J Assh keeper of the granary 20 quarters by 1 tally. And in sale as within 2 quarters 5 bushels. And in gain [avant'] for the same 2 pecks. Sum as above. And it balances.



Malt The same answers for 2 quarters of malt brewed from barley as above. And for 2 bushels of increment of the same. Sum 2 quarters 2 bushels. And the whole accounted in harvest expenses. And it balances.
